## Galgotias University Students Learn to Master Stress and Time

Galgotias University, School of Hospitality and Tourism has introduced a session for students typically on how to manage stress and time. The session was conducted on 25th of July in collaboration with HCL healthcare under the mentorship of Dr. Rajiv Mishra. The beneficiary segment was initially expedited by Ms. Indu Chauhan. She is a trained psychologist specialized in psychoanalysis and psychotherapist from HCL healthcare centre respectively. However, the objective of the event is to grant students with some practical skills and strategies for how to manage time effectively and how to cope up with stress, these are the crucial aspects required on the ongoing demand for hospitality and tourism sectors. These techniques will drive students to easily achieve success in their life. The official session was stated with a brief introduction given by Ms. Chauhan, who stressed on the importance of time management in the field of academics and achieving goals. Although, she also discussed about the challenges faced by students in managing time. One of the major obstacle is 'procastination' which signifies the art of delay something. Other challenges may include distractions, unrealistic expectations, etc. Further, she suggested some practical techniques for reducing these challenges which includes prioritizing important tasks, how to say no, time blocking etc. One of the best techniques is following SMART goals. SMART stands for 'Specific', 'Measurable', 'Achievable', 'Relevant' and 'Time Bound'. She emphasized the importance of making a balanced schedule which includes time for studies, extracurricular activities and personal being as well. Moreover, she introduced some of the physiological and psychological aspects of stress and how it affects overall health of an individual. She discussed about the stress sources that most of the students faced in their lifestyle. Some stress factors are academic pressures, social challenges and career uncertainties. In order to cope up with these factors, she has presented some stress management strategies like mindfulness, deep breathing exercises as well as some progressive muscle relaxing techniques. Meanwhile, she has highlighted the importance of maintaining a healthy lifestyle including a balanced diet with some workout with proper sleep. These are some of the essential elements of stress management. The session was specifically designed for students to share their experiences and obstacles which also has allowed Ms. Chauhan to share personalized solutions to the students. The key factors of this segment include building resilience and how to develop a growth mindset. The informative session was ended with questionnaire segment where the students have the opportunity to ask questions and also seek personalized guidance as well.

# Budget Allocation in India: Viksit Bharat

The new budget for our ‘Viksit Bharat’ has been allocated and it focuses on four major castes which include, ‘Annadata, Garib, Mahilayen, Yuva’. The budget theme revolves around employment, skilling, MSMEs and Middle class. Viksit Bharat focuses on some priorities which includes, Productivity and resilience in agriculture. New varieties has been released that are 109 new high yielding and climate resilient varieties of 32 field and horticulture crops will be released for cultivation by farmers. 1 Crore farmers across the country will be initiated into natural farming, supported by certification and branding in next two years. Financing for shrimp farming, processing and export will be facilitated through NABARD and DPI for coverage of farmers and their land in three years. Jan Samarth based kisan credit cards will also be issued under this priority. The next priority that Viksit Bharat focuses on is employment and skilling. 3 schemes has been released under this priority that are, scheme A (first timers), scheme B (job creation in manufacturing) and schemes C (support to employers). Scheme A is about giving wage to new entrants in all formal sectors in three installments up to rupees 15,000, which is expected to benefit 210 lakh youth, scheme B is linked to first time employees giving incentive to both employee and employer for EPFO contributions. Under this scheme C, government will reimburse EPFO contributions of employer up to rupees 3000 per month for two years by which it is expected to generate 50 lakh jobs. The 4th scheme released under this priority focuses on skills, 20 lakh youth will be skilled over a 5 year period. 1000 industrial training institutes will be upgraded in hub and spoke arrangements with out come orientation and financial support for loans up to rupees 10 lakh for higher education would be provided by the government but for only domestic institutions. Another priority for visit Bharat is, inclusive human resource development and social justice. This priority focuses on planning for endowment rich states in the eastern parts covering Bihar, Jharkhand, W Bengal, Odisha and Andhra Pradesh for generation of economic opportunities to attain Viksit Bharat. More than rupees 3 lakh crore has been allocated for schemes benefiting women and girls. this priority also focuses on Andhra Pradesh recognition act which says financial support of rupees 15,000 crores will be arranged in FY24 25 and completion of polavaram irrigation project ensuring food security of nation. Some other priorities that has been focused for Viksit Bharat includes manufacturing and services, Urban Development, energy security, infrastructure and next generation reforms. Internship opportunities has been enhanced and aims for providing opportunities in 500 top companies to 1,00,00,000 youth in five years giving allowance of rupees 5000 per month along with a one time assistance of rupees 6000 through CBR funds. The tax proposal has also came in focus under this new budget allocation involving re-

view of income tax 1961, simplification of charities and TDs, litigation and appeal and deepening the tax base. Comprehensive view review of the rate structure for ease of trade, removal of duty intervention and reduction of disputes. New budget for the tax proposal has benefited in affordable medicines for cancer, reduced BCD to 15% on mobile phones and chargers, benefiting in mobile industry. Reduced custom duty on gold and silver to 6% supported energy transition. Standard deduction for salaried employees increased from rupees to 50,000 to rupees 75,000 and deduction of family pension for pensioners increased from rupees 15,000 to rupees 25,000. The new budget has focused on benefiting each category including defense, rural development, agricultur, allied activities, Home Affairs, education, IT and telecom, health, energy, social welfare and commerce and industry but has given the most importance to defence by giving allowance for rupees 454773 crores.
